
#### Colour coded books

## English alphabetic code


- 44 sounds
- 26 letters
- Over 150+ graphemes (letter combinations)

One of the most complex alphabetic codes in the world.

Read Write Inc splits these into Set 1, Set 2 and Set 3 sounds. A digraph is called a 'special friend'.








# Point and sweep (not yellow, blue or grey)





#### After the third read...




Please ensure the book is always left in your child's book bag to ensure it is not lost or damaged. This will need to be in school every day.

A small fee of £3 will be charged for damaged or lost books to cover the cost of a replacement.






#### Which books will children bring home?










Please record each time you listen to your child read their book. It is important that your child reads the book and you listen. If your child struggles with a word, ask them to use their Fred Talk.




# Book Bag Books – 1 or 2

- Extra reading practice at home
- Uniquely matched to the *Read Write Inc.* Phonics Storybooks.
- Reinforce children's learning of phonics at the appropriate level.
- Helps to make even faster progress in reading.













#### What can you do?

- Listen to your child read the same Storybook again and again. At least once a day.
- Encourage them to use 'Special Friends', 'Fred Talk', 'read the word'
- Discuss the story and encourage their storyteller voice.
- Help your child to sound out the letters in words and then 'point and sweep' the sounds together to make a whole word. Please do not refer to the letters by their names.
- Help your child to focus on the 'pure' sounds. You can hear how to say the sounds correctly by searching on YouTube for 'Read Write Inc. Phonemes Pronunciation Guide'.


